Whitney stated that as an electric cooperative, not only does the community benefit from it as a power source, but also as the cooperative upholds a nonprofit status, and those members have a vote toward the affairs of the organization. The cooperative also shares profits with their members. Whitney shared that many of her experiences would not exist if it were not for the electric cooperative that serves her family.

In April the board will appoint a nominating committee. The committee will then meet in May and discuss candidates for the districts mentioned above. If you are interested in running for the board, please contact our office, and we will then have the nominating committee contact you.

There was a board member who only served for nine months but most board members served anywhere from one two-year term up to 45 years, which was Lester Williams. #### FLECTION OF BOARD MEMBERS

The Annual Meeting will be held in June. A nominating committee will be appointed in April. Trustee positions up for re-election are as follows:

**District No. 2 –** Doug Gardner **District No. 8 –** Dave Hayden

Further nominations may be made by petition of 15 or more members, acting together not less than 15 days prior to the Annual Meeting. Nominations by petition, received at least five days before the meeting, shall be included on the official ballot.

Later nominations received by petition shall be treated as nominations from the floor. The chairman shall also call for nominations from the floor for a period of one minute during the time for nominations. No member may nominate more than one candidate.


