special meeting of the Southeast Electric Cooperative members will be held on September 18th, 2020. This is to replace the 2020 Annual Meeting, which was canceled due to the inability to follow guidelines recommended by the governor during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The purpose of this meeting is to conduct business that was scheduled for the Annual Meeting. Trustee elections will be held for districts 5 and 9. District 5 is currently being held by Clayton Jardee, who was appointed after Leroy Jardee resigned

in November. Albert Paul is the incumbent District 9 trustee. Also, a bylaw change regarding the ability to hold mail-in ballot voting will be proposed.

All members are invited to attend this special meeting, just as with the Annual Meeting. Registration will begin at 4 p.m. in the Southeast Electric Garage. Sloppy Joes and chips will be served at 5 p.m. The business meeting will be held in the Southeast Electric Truck Shop. Members attending will vote on one trustee each for districts 5 and 9. As with all trustee elections, the SECO bylaws allow three methods for trustee nominations: A nominating committee which has been appointed, nominations by petition, and nominations from the floor at the annual or special meeting.

The proposed bylaws change will be the addition of wording in Article III, Section 5 of the bylaws and is designed to allow legal voting if ever another Annual Meeting is canceled. The new wording will be:

#### Section 5. VOTING.

Each member shall be entitled to only one vote upon each matter submitted to a vote at a meeting of the members. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members voting thereon in person, or by mail-in ballot, except as otherwise provided by law, the Articles of Incorporation or these bylaws. Mail-in ballots must be returned to the Secretary of the Cooperative via return mail or in person, sealed in the secret ballot envelope furnished by the Cooperative, not later than the close of business the business day prior to the date of the meeting at which the vote is scheduled to occur. Counting of mail-in ballots shall be conducted by a board-appointed committee of not fewer than three members in attendance at the meeting at which the vote is scheduled to occur. All mail-in ballots shall remain sealed until counted. Memberships not voting by mail-in ballot shall be entitled to vote in person at the meeting at which the vote is scheduled to occur. The Board of Trustees shall adopt procedures calculated to ensure that only memberships not voting by mail-in ballot vote in person at the meeting.

At lease 50 members in attendance are required as a quorum to conduct business at the annual meeting or this special meeting. Remember, each member of the cooperative is invited and encouraged to attend. We hope to see a good crowd at this very important membership meeting.
